Akers Fitness Limited (“us” or “we”) are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy.

This Policy sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, or that you provide to us, will be processed by us. It also provides you with information regarding our use of cookies.

INFORMATION WE MAY COLLECT FROM YOU

We may collect and process the following data about you:

- Information that you provide by filling in forms on the Site such as your name, address, date of birth, and email address. This includes information provided to participate in any other functions of our site, complete any surveys or contact us for any other reason;
- Information that you provide to us in the course of the personal training and other services we provide (such as your age, height, weight and other personal statistics by which we may assess your fitness and progress);
- Records of your correspondence (if any) with us;
- Details of your visits to the Site including, but not limited to, traffic data, location data, weblogs and other communication data; and
- Details of any transactions carried out through the Site.

IP ADDRESSES AND COOKIES

We may collect information about your computer, including where available your IP address, operating system and browser type, for system administration and statistical analysis. This is statistical data about our users' browsing actions and patterns, and does not identify any individual.



For the same reason, we may obtain information about your general internet usage by using cookies. A cookie is a small file that is stored on the hard drive of your computer. They help us to improve the Site and to deliver a better and more personalized service. We use the following cookies:

- **Strictly necessary cookies:** These are cookies that are required for the operation of our website. They include, for example, cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of our website or use submission forms.
- **Analytical/performance cookies:** They allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our website when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our website works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily.
- **Functionality cookies:** These are used to recognise you when you return to our website. This enables us to personalise our content for you to remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).
- **Targeting cookies:** These cookies record your visit to our website, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. We will use this information to make our website and the advertising displayed on it more relevant to your interests. We may also share this information with third parties for this purpose.

THE COOKIES OUR SITE USES

You can find more information below, about the individual cookies we use and the purposes for which we use them:

- **Session:** This cookie is essential for the Site to operate. It allows us to remember your details during your current visit to the Site.
- **Authautologin:** This cookie is a functionality cookie, which automatically logs users in if their “session” cookie has expired. This allows you to navigate away from the Site and then return to the Site in the same browsing session.
- **Google Analytics:** This is an analytical / performance cookie. The Site uses Google Analytics to help analyse how users use the website, collecting standard internet log information and visitor behaviour information (from which no user is identifiable). This information is transmitted to Google and processed to compile statistical reports on activity on the Site. These reports allow us to optimise our user experience. Google provide a browser add-on for users who wish to prevent their data from being used by Google Analytics.

Please note that third parties (for example: advertising networks and providers of external services like web traffic analysis services) may also use cookies, over which we have no control. These cookies are likely to be analytical/performance cookies or targeting cookies.

BLOCKING COOKIES

You may block cookies by activating settings on your browser, which allows you to refuse the setting of some or all cookies. If you do so choose to block all cookies (including essential cookies) you may not be able to access all or some parts of the Site.

Most cookies we use are known as session cookies. These cookies will expire whenever you close your browser or shut down your computer, and such cookies need not be blocked. Other cookies used for specific purpose will expire when that purpose is no longer required.

USES MADE OF THE INFORMATION

We use information held about you in the following ways:

Except as provided below, we do not sell, trade or rent your personal information to third parties and will not share your personal information with third party advertisers.

DISCLOSURE OF YOUR INFORMATION

We may disclose your personal information to third parties:

- Who help us run the Site (solely for the purposes of hosting and running the Site and performing the payment transactions concluded through the Site);
- If we or substantially all of our assets are acquired by a third party, in which case personal data held by us about our customers will be one of the transferred assets; or
- If we are under a duty to disclose or share your personal data in order to comply with any legal obligation, or in order to enforce or apply any contract or any other terms or agreements between you and us.



WHERE WE STORE YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

All information you provide to us is stored on our secure servers within the EEA. It may also be processed by staff that works for us or for one of our suppliers (such as our hosting or payment processing providers), each of whom is located within the EEA. By submitting your personal data you consent to this processing. We will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this privacy policy. Any payment transactions will be encrypted. Where we have given you (or where you have chosen) a password, which enables you to access certain parts of our site, you are responsible for keeping this password confidential. We ask you not to share a password with anyone. Unfortunately, the transmission of information via the internet is not completely secure. Although we will use our best endeavours to protect your personal data, we cannot guarantee the security of your data transmitted to the Site and any transmission is at your own risk. Once we have received your information, we will use suitable procedures and security features to try to prevent unauthorised access.

YOUR RIGHTS
